Open your heart

Local matchmaker to host Lock and Key Singles Party

Guys, it may never be this easy to unlock your true love's heart.

Men will hold the keys — literally — at an up coming event where the women will wear locks around their necks. It's all part of the third Lock and Key Singles Party noon to 3 p.m. Sund ay at the Santa Barbara Polo & Racquet Club, 3300 Via Real, Carpinteria. The fee, \$22 in advance and \$32 at the door, includes a drink, appetizers, valet parking and viewing of that day's two polo matches.

The goal is to find a mate that fits.
Lisa Darsonval, owner of Santa Barbara
Matchmaking, the business behind the
party, said she would tell men attending the
event: "Idid all the work for you and got all
the women. You just have to show up!" The
dating coach laughed.

Even if the men and women don't immediately see fireworks, at least they'll get a chance to win more than \$2,000 worth

of prizes. Every time a man opens a lock, both the man and woman turn in the key and lock for tickets for drawings for restaurant certificates, services at salons, a massage, jewelry, books, tarot readings and more. The man and woman then get a new key and lock and can meet other people.

The man or woman who turns in the most keys or locks wins the Lock smith Award and free admission to two future Lock and Key Singles parties.

The first parties were attended by 30 people in October at EOS Lounge on Anacapa Street and 60 people in February at Kalyra By the Sea winery on State Street. Ms. Darsonval expects 120 people at Sunday's party. Typically people in their 30 s to 50 s attend the events but adults of all ages are welcome. Ms. Darsonval manages registration on her website, www.lockandkeyevents.com/sb, so that it's an even split of women and men. (If too many women register, she closes that part of the

website until the men catch up.)

The nice thing is there's no fear of rejection, Ms. Darsonval said. "Nobody says, 'No, you can't try to unlock my lock!' It just doesn't happen. Everybody is there for the same reason (to meet people and win prizes)."

If a man and womand ecide they're not interested in each other, they simply part ways after turning in their lock and key, Ms. Darsonval said. But it's possible to meet someone you like a lot, she said, adding that she knows of two couples who started dating after meeting each other at the parties.

"There was this one couple (in their 30 s); they were so cute and obvious," Ms. Darsonval said. "For the two of them, it didn't matter that there were 50 people around them. They walked out, connected with each other, armin arm. They were really adorable."

"Everybody loves the event," she added, referring to notes she has read on her company's Facebook page. She said the mentypically need more encouragement to go to the parties than the women, but both gend ers are glad they're there.

She said the key and lock are a good icebreaker and have inspired men to say funny pickup lines. (Keep them classy, guys, she advised.)

Sunday's party is among those presented nationally by Lock and

Key Events. Ms. Darsonval signed a contract with the company to hold the Santa Barbara parties. She said Lock and Key Events, which normally recommends holding the events in bars and publicizes them on its website (www.lock.andkeyev.ents.com), never heard of one in a polo field.

"They said, 'Are you kidding me?' "Ms. Darsonval recalled. "I said, 'I know Santa Barbara; it's going to be popular.' "

The location of the up coming event came about after the pol o club contacted Ms. Darsonval, who started Santa Barbara Matchmaking on Valentine's Day

in 2012 and was trained during seminars held by Matchmakers Alliance, a national nonprofit.
